ITC History

- Created by Arne Jensen
 - to cater to the emerging need to understand and model traffic in telephone networks using stochastic methodologies
 - to bring together researchers with these considerations as a common theme
- First Congress in Copenhagen, Denmark in memory of A.K.
 Erlang with name
- The First International Congress on the Application of the Theory of Probability in Telephone Engineering and Administration
- An International Advisory Committee (IAC) was designated to represent the corresponding community

ITC History

- Frequency: every 3 years like many congresses back then
- Paper selection: mainly made by the IAC first by invitations and later based on abstracts
- Name International Teletraffic Congress (ITC) coined for 3rd event (1961)
- ITC 3 ITC 13: from Wednesday till Tuesday, including social events during the week-end

What People Said

« In the early days of the ITC it was the main forum where the telcos and academics interacted and gave rise to a number of important research areas and results. »

« I joined the "networking" organization at Bell Labs at a time (1960s) when the major work of our "Center (about 100 people)" was teletraffic, our researchers and managers were well-known in the ITC community and the ITC was the way we communicated our important ideas and results to the world. It was an exhilarating time. »



Abstract: Titles of 925 conference papers contained in the first ten International Teletraffic Conferences (1955–1983) are analyzed in terms of word distributions. The aim is to determine how information about changing word frequencies and word patterns relates to the kind of information gained through the more traditional approach of intellectual history. Additionally, we consider what each approach can reveal about the information flows involved in the production and utilization of knowledge in teletraffic. In terms of methodology, the goal of this dual approach is to understand how the analysis of word and document structures can be used both as a scientometric tool and as a tool for historical research. We also comment more generally on the significance of conferences as an object for scientometric analysis, particularly with respect to the emergence and growth of the engineering and industrial sciences.




What People Said






What People Said
